CIRCLES OF SUPPORT weekly support meetings are now being held every Tuesday evening from 6-8 p.m. to help families overcome poverty. Circles of Support are based on "Beyond Welfare," a nonprofit organization which has been able to help families out of poverty for under \$2,500 for each family. The average family helped had been on welfare for 4.8 years and took about 18 months to get off welfare. The goal of the program locally is to end poverty in the tri city, one important family at a time. These

support meetings are open to everyone - those who might need help as well as those who might like to become involved in a "circle" to offer support (skills, information and/or friendship and encouragement) to a family trying to leave welfare. Children are welcome and attendees should plan to stay for the entire session (6-8 p.m.). Snacks and beverages are provided.
