In 2008, while serving as Executive Director of Sakhi for South Asian Women, she won the inaugural SONY South Asian Excellence Award for Social Service. She has mobilized cultural responsivity for survivors and communities of color through research, coalition building, and systemic change towards language access, economic justice, and community-centered solutions. In 2014, she co-facilitated **Movement to Power**, a creative healing workshop series for survivors, advocates, and community members. She recently completed a year-long study and report, *Seeding Generations*, which depicts new strategies for services for people who cause harm. Her poetry book, *Terrain Tracks*, won the Many Voices Prize. Her second book, *Miracle Marks*, is forthcoming in 2019.

**Team ASAFSF** represents the diversity of South Asia, trained in DV advocacy, each with over 8-10 years of experience. Their innovative methods of advocacy are based on the unique cultural dynamics that shape DV in the South Asian community, and they can bridge the gaps in services with mainstream DV service agencies.
