To promote awareness, training and advocacy to statewide crime victim service providers. We are committed to the enhancement and protection of victims' rights and needs.

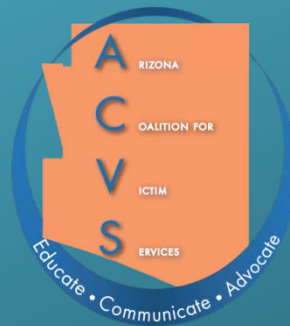
Who We Are:

What We Do:

Bi-monthly meetings:

The ACVS membership meets every other month allowing members to network with one another, learn about new programs and service providers, and receive funding updates.

Service Provider Trainings:

The basic Arizona Victim Assistance Academy (AVAA) is a 40 hour, week-long training that provides a fundamental overview of the field of victim advocacy. Since 2004 the AVAA has trained approximately 800 advocates.

ACVS also provides advanced academy training for seasoned advocates and partners with other agencies to put on various conferences throughout the year.

Relocation Project:

This program provides financial assistance to victims of crime in relocating to a place of safety. Please visit our website for additional details.
